
SPALDWICK VILLAGE NEWS

A NEW YEAR MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

The year that has just come to an end has been a difficult one for many. The troubles of the financial world are affecting most of us; some have lost their jobs, those with mortgages may have negative equity, the retired find the value of their savings or pensions greatly reduced. Environmental issues and fighting in the Middle East also concern us, yet governments (including our own) seem reluctant to do anything to reduce the effects of modern living on the future of the planet.

So we are generally worried about what the new year will bring. Will the rest of the world be overwhelmed by the troubles in the Middle East? Will the whole structure of society as we know it come crashing down around us?

Of course nobody can give a totally reassuring answer to any of these questions, but I hold onto two positive teachings of one whose birth we have recently celebrated at Christmas, Jesus Christ himself. One is that worrying does not help anybody. He told those who worried about where the next meal might come from, "Trust in God, who knows all your needs". Tom Jackson of Royston Avenue, one of Spaldwick's oldest residents, died on 30th November aged 92. Tom was born in Yorkshire in 1916 and lived there, except for war service in the RAF, until 1960 when he moved to Spaldwick. He came with his wife, Vivian who he had met and married in Peterborough in 1947, and three children.

He worked in the old garage for many years but also, in his spare time, as a woodworker. He did many jobs for the village, re-furbishments in the church, toys for sale at Fetes and help with the Fetes. He was always willing, always good humoured and was a leading member of the Bowls Club and the Welcome Club until ill-health curtailed his activities.

His Yorkshire accent had softened after nearly 50 years in Spaldwick but never completely went. He is missed by his family and his many friends.
