

There have been several reports of a Red Kite in Easton recently, and John Blatch has seen a pair over Spaldwick too. So this morning I was delighted to watch one myself circling over the central field at Easton. For a long time kites were restricted to Wales but they were saved from national extinction by

one of the world's longest running protection programmes, and have now been successfully re-introduced to England and Scotland by the RSPB. They feed on carrion, small mammals and worms and there are now over 1600 pairs in Britain. They are breeding at Holme Fen and in Northamptonshire, and there is no reason why they should not colonise one of our other local woodlands in the next few years.

Apart from the Buzzard, which is also well established locally, the only other large breeding raptor in the county is the Marsh harrier, which breeds at Fendrayton Pits, and which I saw last year. There, too, you will hear or see a large selection of song birds, including Yellow hammer, White-throat, Lesser whitethroat, Blackcap, Garden warbler, Reed and Sedge warblers, as well as Cuckoo. Don't forget our own "Spring Listen" walk around Easton on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> May starting at Brook House about 6 a.m. and finishing with breakfast at the Bells, 4 Broadweir.

## Free support for Carers, and Adults or Parents with a Disability



Speaking Up is an independent advocacy organisation, based around Cambridgeshire and offers free advocacy services to help you with understanding your rights or helping you to make informed decisions. Advocacy is supporting people to speak up about the things they want. As an independent organisation Speaking Up can work with people to put their views forward without the constraints often imposed by statutory organisations such as Social Services. Advocates do not tell their clients what to do, they work with people to explore options/possibilities and support them in the choices they make.

**Carers Advocacy** It is thought that 1 in 10 people in Cambridgeshire are unpaid carers. Many people don't even realise that they are carers; it's just something that they do in their daily lives. Looking after elderly relatives or friends who need help can be extremely rewarding, but many unpaid carers do not realise that they also have rights and can access a support network themselves.

**Community Advocacy** Speaking Up's Community Advocates support people with learning, physical or sensory disabilities to have their say and get their views heard. They can provide support with issues such as housing, care, health and complaints as well as general queries on your rights and support options.

**Family Advocacy** Our Speaking Up for Families Advocates work with parents with a learning difficulty to ensure they are aware of their rights and get the right support to perform their parenting role.
