I wish you all well - bye for now...

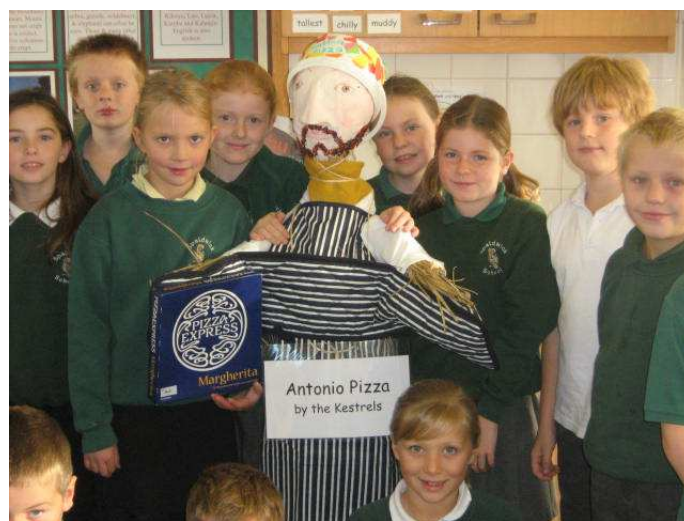
