ROGER'S GARDENING TIPS

Plague Arrives In Spaldwick!

I had hoped against hope that the dreaded disease that has attacked the lovely Horse Chestnuts in and around Huntingdon would pass us by, but over the last couple of weeks the tell-tale brown blotches have started to appear on my three trees and also on the trees of our neighbour, John Blatch. It is horrible to drive into Huntingdon and see all those lovely trees around Hinchbrooke looking so brown and bare. My trees appear to be infected by Leaf Blotch Fungus (*Guignardia Aesculi*) and not caterpillars of the small moth *Cameraria Ohridella* or "bleeding canker", both of which can be fatal. So hopefully these trees will return to their full glory next year and Joyce and Grahame will still be able to call their B&B "Chestnut View!"

Now is the time to get into your borders and have a good tidy up and get rid of all those weeds before they seed. Autumn is the time of year when I like to dig up and split any overgrown clumps of perennials as I always think they grow away better now than in the Spring when the soil takes a while to warm up. If you need to move shrubs, conifers or small trees this is an ideal time; they are going into dormant mode, but will still establish well before the cold weather sets in.

In October bare-rooted roses, fruit trees and field grown shrubs become available for planting so if you have any new ones to plant, now is a great time to do it. The same applies to hedging and also, don't forget to

get your winter bedding and bulbs off to an early start before the ground gets saturated again.

Now that the garden season is coming to an end, I will be singing off until the spring and let's hope the weather is kinder in 2009.

Allotment Update

We have now heard from Anglian Water following our application for a water supply to be connected to the allotments and regrettably they are not in a position to help us with the cost which they have estimated will be £1700!

We will also have to pay water rates, rabbit fence the area we want to use, pay rent (which is under review) and take out indemnity insurance, so you can see the costs are rising. We have re-applied to the National Lottery Local Food Scheme for funding, having been turned down first time round so we are ever hopeful. When the weather was at its wettest, Stewart Barnard and I went to inspect and measure the suggested site and found that one area had flooded but one of the ditches adjacent was very shallow so this may have been the cause of the problem.

We will let everyone know what progress we make in the next few months regarding funding.

SPALDWICK OIL BUYING GROUP

Thank you to all those who have expressed an interest in joining the Spaldwick Oil Buying Group; our chief aim is to see if we can use our collective buying power to reduce the cost of oil for all participants.

We sent out a brief questionnaire to all those that registered interest, to confirm everyone's requirements and to gather the data we need to establish a robust supply framework. Once we have analysed the questionnaire returns, we will be able to engage with a range of oil companies to negotiate a suitable deal.

The basic idea is that we will arrange a "call off arrangement" with agreed service levels & discounts. Participants will be able to call the approved supplier, place their order and pay directly against the agreed terms and conditions. No payments will go through the Oil Buying Group.

We aim to conclude the exercise by end of October, with the framework effective in early November.

Listening to Our Pupils' Views and Ideas

The Fruity Tooties, This is the name of our Healthy Eating Team. It includes pupils from every class, and they meet regularly. Recently they have been very busy entering competitions as well as spreading the word about healthy eating! The team won a prize in the Active Kids Get Cooking competition organised by Sainsbury. This prize was a visit to a pig farm to see the pigs in their own environment and then on to Sainsbury to view the finished product!

They have also entered the Grow Your Potato Competition, finishing with a creditable 1250g of potatoes which they enjoyed cooked with sausages and plenty of butter! And finally, they have just won a monetary prize in the Key Stage 2 category of the Schools Healthy Eating/Local Produce Competition organised by Huntingdon District Council. For this they created a poster showing local food and farming.

Well done to them all!

The members are now judging the entries to a 'design a soup' challenge they set the pupils. The winning soup will be served at our Harvest Celebration Lunch in October.

The Hooting Parliament is our School Council. The council meets every three weeks to discuss concerns and ideas raised by the classes, as well as to carry out

challenges given to them by Mr Canavan, who is the teacher representative. They are currently preparing a talk they will present to the Spaldwick Welcome Club entitled 'coming to school in 2008.'

Playleaders - Y5 pupils who organise lunchtime game activities. The pupils have been trained as young leaders by Pat Forster, Hinchingsbrooke Sports College, and now lead a collection of games and challenges for the rest of the school pupils. These include skipping, target wall, stacking cups and basketball.

The Sound Squad is our newest pupil voice group. Each class 2 pupils who are learning new songs with our music teacher, Miss Body. They then teach them to their class. The sound squad also keep a log of favourite songs and when singing is used during the school day, such as to complete the register, multiplication tables tests!, in the playground. The school will be using the work of our Sound Squad members to support our application to become a 'Sing up School' - we are aiming for GOLD!!
