CONTACTING THE POLICE FOR ASSISTANCE

Call 999 for serious emergencies in which human life and limb are deemed to be at risk, or when a crime has just happened or is in progress and those believed to be responsible are still in the vicinity. It is appreciated that that many occurrences can fall into this category and situations may change quickly, but if, in your opinion, the definition fits then dial 999.

The police Operations Centre will assess your call using any other information received about the incident and decide the appropriate response to meet the emergency. Sometimes it is necessary, when many calls for assistance are received at the same time, for them to decide which call must take priority so it is important to make clear in your call exactly what the dangers are as the situation is developing.

Call **0345 455 4564** for any other form of police assistance, usually being described as non-emergency. This means incidents not involving life or limb risks or where a crime has happened and those responsible are not present in the area.
