The accounts above may seem to show that Spaldwick Church is doing quite well, with income exceeding expenditure by £658, unfortunately this not so. Expenditure is down because we are simply not paying our way in the form of our contribution to cost of providing our Vicar, the Parish Share. Based on our village size we should have paid £4500. Last year and in previous years we paid £3500, a better sum but still not the full amount but with our small congregation we can no longer afford to do this.

We are grateful to all those who do help, either by direct donations such as Gift Aid, or by supporting our fund-raising activities. We already have three planned for this year, a Pancake Stall in the church on Shrove Tuesday 8th March, a Quiz in the school on 19th March and a Garden Party on 30th April. Later we will have the Harvest Festival, Advent Fair and the Carol Party. Please do help by supporting these events.

Escape, Spaldwick's new Youth Group, is now running regular Youth Nights at the village school.


