TOP TIPS TO KEEP SAFE THIS SUMMER

- Inform your neighbours if you are going away
- Take keys out of window locks so they can't be seen from the outside
- Keep track of ALL your keys
- Make sure outbuildings are locked. Keep back gates locked and check fencing is secure
- Secure outside ladders so they can't be used to break into your house
- If you have a burglar alarm use it
- Report a theft to the police as soon as possible and obtain a crime reference number
- Be sensible about the information you post <u>online</u> and be especially cautious if you plan to go away
- Take photographs of valuables and keep receipts or valuations.
- Consider registering on www.immobilise.com this is supported by most UK Police forces.
