

Spaldwick sends 100 boxes of aid for Ukrainian refugees - by Diana Sands

When the news of war and spiralling numbers of refugees started to fill our news, we all watched and felt hopeless and helpless. It was really difficult to watch the drama unfolding for millions of people in Ukraine.

Spaldwick responded wonderfully to a call for donations that I put on the Facebook village page. I was hoping to gather enough content for 10 boxes to send to Romania. Instead, we raised upwards of 100 boxes containing bedding, towels, personal care products, food and baby care items. I was overwhelmed by the generosity of everyone in the village.

The amount of donations raised meant that we had to scale up the transport too. The initial 10 boxes that I started collecting for were sent to Lasi, my home town, to a charity that encourages pregnant mums and women with infants to take refuge there. The remaining boxes were transported to London and Hertfordshire to be loaded into bigger lorries bound for Romania and Poland.

I would like to thank everyone in the village who helped in collecting, sorting and transporting the donations - it turned into a massive operation with a time limit to achieve it. It couldn't have been done without the help of everyone who stepped up: a group of volunteers to create drop off points; other people helped packed boxes and loaded the packages into vans. Agrovista played a key role in the success of the operation by giving us a space to store, sort and pack the goods donated.

Many good things came out of this process. The refugees are not the only ones who benefitted from our donations. Donating made us feel that we can do something to help. The crisis also brought together people from different groups in the village and strengthen Spaldwick's community spirit. I for one feel very lucky to live in such a wonderful place!

Spaldwick School's efforts for Ukraine

Spaldwick Primary School's been busy raising money and sending support for the people of Ukraine.

A day where pupils dressed in blue and yellow - the colours of the Ukrainian flag-managed to raise more than £200 for the First News Ukraine Appeal.

Friends of Spaldwick School organised a clothing collection (pictured right). Donations from parents and staff are now being taken to help refugees in Poland, who have fled the war.

Securing your home - It is vital to leave your home secure whenever you go out. Getting into an 'exit routine' can help ensure that you don't forget obvious, important things.

Here's what you should do just before you go out. Become a creature of habit:



- Close and lock all your doors and windows, even if you're only going out for a few minutes
- Make sure that valuables are out of sight
- Keep handbags away from the letterbox or cat flap and hide all keys including car keys, as a thief could hook keys or valuables through even a small opening
- Never leave car documents or ID in obvious places
 - In the evening, shut the curtains and leave lights on
- Out all day? Then use a timer device to automatically turn lights and a radio on at night
- Set your burglar alarm
- Make sure the side gate is locked and lock your shed or garage
- Lock your bike inside a secure shed or garage

Reporting a crime:

- If it's an emergency and the crime is still taking place, call 999 and ask for the police.
- If it's not an emergency, do not call 999. This doesn't mean the crime is not important it just helps the police to make the best use of their resources. Many police forces use the 101 non-emergency number.
- If you have information regarding a crime and don't want to talk to the police, contact Crimestoppers online or call 0800 555 111. You will remain 100% anonymous. Always.

Young cancer patients to benefit from wig, thanks to Heidi's hair donation



Spaldwick resident Heidi has been growing her hair for 20 months to donate to Little Princess Trust, who turn real hair donations into wigs for children and young people, up to 24 years, who have lost their own hair through cancer treatment or other conditions.

On 9th March, Heidi had her hair cut to donate 8.5 inches to the charity. She said: "I have never had my hair this short before and wouldn't ordinarily choose to go this short, but it is worthwhile it if it makes a difference to a child or young person going through a tough time"

Little Princess Trust has been helping young people since 2006. From receiving hair donations at their office, through to fitting and styling a bespoke wig, it costs the charity from £550 to provide a real-hair wig free-of-charge, to their wig recipients. They currently supply over 150 wigs every month. As well as donating her own hair,

Heidi has set up a Just Giving Page and hopes to raise £550 to help cover the cost of creating and fitting the wig for the child or young person who will receive it.
