


Spaldwick's Speed indicator signs - by Parish Cllr Greg Rice

The Parish Council has been trying to minimise the speed of vehicles driving through Spaldwick. We are keen to make drivers aware of the speed limit and encourage them to stay within the legal limits.

In June 2022, the first of the Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs (MVAS) electronic signs was installed on the High Street and in October 2023, a second MVAS was installed on Stow Road.

The MVAS have recorded over half a million vehicles entering the village this year. On average, motorists are driving at just over 26 mph and over 85% of them are driving below 30mph. In fact, less than 1% of drivers are driving over 40mph. As you can see, there are some drivers that do drive at excessive speeds through the village, the worst case being 79 mph in February, but the trend is decreasing over time.



The Parish Council is currently seeking funding for a third sign to be situated on Thrapston Road, which will then cover all entry points to the village.

The club hosted Gransden in the final friendly match of the year.


