

Poppies cascading from a tree towards the village green War Memorial formed part of this year's Remembrance Sunday tributes in Spaldwick.

Despite restrictions placed on public gatherings, it was possible to lay wreaths at the monument. Residents were also invited to pay their respects with a two-minute silence on their doorsteps as a nod to the fallen - and a mark of respect to current and past servicemen and women.

St James Church bells were rung for the occasion and a pre-recorded service made available by the Vicar.



## **Christmas Eve Celebrations & Window Crib Displays**

In line with Government guidelines the church is shut for the current time. But, we are busy making plans for **Christmas Eve**.

From 3.30-4.30pm, we plan to host a family friendly church walk: We would like to encourage you to donate a non-perishable food item to our collection for Godmanchester Food Bank, then enjoy the carols and fairy lights, light a candle for a moment of reflection and discover the crib displays by following the children's "find the reindeer" trail. # Spaldwick Neighbourhood Watch - by coordinator David Henrick

I have noticed an increase in unwanted telephone calls recently.

Scammers will call you on the telephone to obtain your personal details - or to persuade you to send them money for some sort of transaction. Research by Citizens Advice suggests that scams experienced by people aged 65 and over are more likely to occur through phone calls, while younger people are more likely to experience online or email fraud.



## Some common telephone scams include - Posing as officials from your bank:

Scammers call you to say that your bank account has been fraudulently accessed and therefore a new 'safe' account is opened for you to transfer your money to.

Lloyds Bank has an advert on radio stations at the moment – stating that they would never phone their customers and ask them to transfer money.



## **Spaldwick Parish Council**

October's meeting was held on Thursday 15th by video conference, due to current Covid-19 restrictions.

Attending the meeting virtually were: Chairman Steve Fane de Salis, Vice Chairman G Smith, S Jackson-Rimmer, S Parfrey, W Burcham, Clerk S Cardwell, County & District Councillor Ian Gardener and seven members of the public. Here are some of the points raised:

## **Public Open Forum:**

Five parishioners addressed the meeting to voice concerns about traffic and vehicular conduct in the village. Examples were given regarding instances of speeding, inappropriate parking, navigating blind

-spots, failure to give way and driving the wrong way along one-way streets. The potential for damage to old properties in a conservation area was also raised, along with a recent accident. Safety concerns were especially highlighted in relation to school children and users of the bus-stops and pub.

**County & District Clir I Gardener then addressed the meeting:** He responded to some of the concerns raised, suggesting the Council could consider a Local Highways Improvement bid, detailing various traffic calming measures implemented in the local area and some guide costings. He also volunteered to arrange for a Highways engineer to visit the village to assess potential traffic calming measures.

Cllr Gardener then went on to update Councillors regarding the following items: (i) The recognition that Cambridgeshire has received for its work to respond to the climate change emergency - with research being conducted to aid development of its draft Climate Change and Environment Strategy and a vision "to deliver net zero carbon emissions for Cambridgeshire by 2050".

- (ii) How the Covid campaign is based around prevention and containing outbreaks to help protect the most vulnerable, highlighting the importance of good hygiene, social distancing and wearing a face covering in various enclosed locations. The County Council is also working on plans to stimulate economic recovery in the local area
- (iii) A pilot scheme is being prepared to stimulate the home care market, encouraging new micro enterprises into the market, generating employment opportunities and facilitating more locally-run, flexible services to suit specific needs.

# Highways, footpaths, byways, gritting bin, trees, etc.

An email has been received from a resident regarding safety concerns and traffic issues within the village - with a request to consider additional measures that could be taken. Cllr S Jackson-Rimmer informed the Council that she already had a meeting scheduled with County & District Cllr I Gardener regarding this matter. Cllr S Fane de Salis proposed a village-wide review.

Cllr S Jackson- Rimmer to follow-up with Cllr Gardener regarding concerns raised by residents during the public forum; Cllrs S Parfrey and S Fane de Salis to assist.

# Reopening of Spaldwick Community Room:

The Clerk advised that only one hire enquiry has been received since the community room was closed due to the current pandemic. The Clerk is to investigate prices for additional cleaning supplies likely required for re-opening.

# **Further Discussion of Defibrillator:**

The East Anglian Ambulance Service has been advised that the Council would like to proceed provided funding can be arranged. Cllr S Parfrey has commenced the funding request.

# **Town & Poors Charity Field**

A request regarding beehives has been made by a resident for the allotment field. The Council discussed the request and Cllr W Burcham proposed agreement in principal, ahead of the request to be passed to the Allotment Association for consideration; this was seconded by Cllr G Smith and carried unanimously.

## Ultrafast Internet - by Jason Patel, Spaldwick's Broadband Champion

Thank you to everyone who has supported the village by pledging vouchers. We are about to become one of the best-connected rural communities in the UK. Our latest campaign to bring full-fibre broadband to Spaldwick has been successful, and this will now arrive in 2021!

This is further confirmed on Openreach's broadband checker (below):

Full Fibre (Fibre to the Premises - FTTP)

Technology that supports speeds up to 1Gbps

Faster and more reliable fibre is coming to your area soon. Full Fibre is our fastest technology, but your exact speed will depend on which broadband provider and package you choose.

We can now expect to see very little in terms of updates, however I have heard reports that BT Openreach has been seen driving around the village checking the existing ducting and access hatches. There are also planned works on the A14 with BT at the end of November.
