Huntingdonshire Ramblers enjoy Spaldwick's views



It is widely considered that getting outdoors and going for a walk, whatever the season, is a great way to boost your health and happiness.

Taking part in a group walk with a trained leader offers the additional benefits of socialising while not having to plan a route nor running the risk of getting lost! There

are a number of walking groups in the area, from small informal groups to planned programmes.

Of the latter, Wellbeing Walks (run by Huntingdonshire District Council) organises outings on weekdays which mostly cover 3 to 4 miles and last approximately 1 hour. Walks are free to join. Pre-booking is encouraged but not required. Further details can be found on the District Council website at: www.huntingdonshire.gov.uk/leisure/wellbeing-walks/

Huntingdonshire Ramblers is part of the national group. Walks typically take place at weekends but many are arranged on weekdays and evenings, particularly in summer. Pictured is one of our recent walks in and around Spaldwick. There is a programme throughout the year offering a variety of routes in the countryside around Huntingdon, across Cambridgeshire and the surrounding area. They are mostly rated leisurely or moderate but the volunteer leaders are always on the lookout for a hill or two to climb.

Distances vary from 4 to 14 miles (7 to 23 km). Booking is not required and the walks listings explain when and where to meet and what to expect. New walkers are welcome to go along and try one or two of the walks for free before taking out Ramblers' membership.

Whether it's your Facebook, Amazon, or Netflix account, the explosion in popularity of online apps and services means more and more of us have to remember an increasingly long list of passwords.



Unfortunately, some of us cope with this challenge by resorting to practices that leave our data, devices and money at risk - by using the same password across multiple accounts, or by creating simple passwords that could easily be guessed by hackers.

Bad password practice is more prevalent than you might think. The UK's National Cyber Security Centre carried out analysis of passwords leaked in data breaches and found that more than 23 million users worldwide used 123456 as a password. You can read more about it here:
