The Public Accessible AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is a compact, portable device which can be used on an adult or child, when it has been recognised that they have had a sudden cardiac arrest or heart attack.

The AED is designed specifically for untrained members of the public to use, and as the first 8 minutes of heart failure are the most vital, the use of a defibrillator on a patient during this time, increases survival considerably.

Are you getting a good Full Fibre deal? By Jason Patel, Spaldwick's Broadband Champion

It's now been more than two years since Spaldwick upgraded to Full Fibre (FTTP). Since October 2021, upwards of 50% of the village has signed up.

It means there's now a good chance your original contract could be ending. As with all services, it doesn't normally pay to be loyal - and new customers get much better deals. If you want to save some money, take action now!

The change-overs are pretty simple for most - you pick a date, the provider sends you a new router, you install it and it just works. As an example, my bill has reduced by £40 a month going from £76 to £36 for the same speed service at 900Mbps.

I would suggest visiting each providers' website directly, or using a comparison site such as broadbanddeals.co.uk

Here's a table to make your life a little easier, but feel free to change or stick as you like (Note: Price per Month is average over the contract term, including any setup charges):

Spaldwick was one of the first rural villages in the UK to get standard ADSL broadband, in 2004, following a successful local demand registration scheme.

Following a subsequent local registration campaign, we were then one of the first rural villages in the UK to get 'superfast' fibre broadband, and received significant national attention. Fibre broadband was switched on in 2014, and take-up in the village quickly exceeded 80%, with one of the highest take-ups in Cambridgeshire and across the UK.

The ultimate broadband technology – called Fibre-to-the-Premises (FTTP) offers improved reliability and connection speeds up to 1 Gbps (1000) Mbps).

A campaign, warning us about the dangers of an emerging scam, has started.

Quishing, also known as QR code phishing, involves tricking someone into scanning a phony QR code with their phone or device. The QR code then takes the user to a fraudulent website that might download malware or ask for sensitive information. It's the latest trend used by scammers to get to your hard-earned cash.

In some cases victims have lost thousands. One victim lost £13,000 after scanning a code on a station parking machine.

QR codes are often found on things like parking machines, charging points, emails, even restaurant menus. Once scanned, scam codes will take you to a bogus website where you innocently input your details thinking you're paying for a service or visiting the genuine site, when in fact, you're sharing all your personal details with the scammers.

Trust your instincts. If something doesn't seem right, don't share your details.
