


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#### Spaldwick Allotments - Looking ahead to warmer and drier weather, by Carmen Martos

May has been unusually colder and wetter than normal, delaying the planting out of seedlings but encouraging a multitude of weeds to grow. One suggestion to weaken a plant (usually a weed) according to the ideology of lunar planting (a concept stemming back to the ancient Egyptians and Babylonians to grow plants according to the cycles of the waning and waxing moon), is to prune a plant during a waxing moon so any sap does not reach the plant's roots, which would make it rise again.

As we (hopefully) look forward to warmer and drier weather, the month of June and in particular Solstice (21 June), considered to be the longest day of the year, marks the beginning of summer. In the vegetable growing community, an old wives' tale, or should I say, an old gardener's tale is that garlic that was planted out on the shortest day of the previous year (20 or 21 December), is ready to be harvested on the longest day of the following year, 21 June.





Strawberry plants are relishing this weather, firing off their 'runners' to produce more mini strawberry plants. One only has to see our allotmenteers' plots to see that almost every plot has at least one strawberry plant flourishing. Fingers and toes crossed for a bumper year of strawberries.

Not only did Amey Waste Management (literally) deliver, but Dan and Jon, based at Amey, Waterbeach, exceeded expectations – they delivered 14 tonnes of soil conditioner to the allotment site for FREE for all of our allotmenteers to use!



A huge thanks to them and also to Lisa for charming them and organising the delivery.



In the last month, Spaldwick Allotments welcomed another three families (at the time of writing) to the site, making a total sum of 26 tended plots. We have two new plots available on a first come basis – a larger plot measuring approx. 14m x 10.6m (£29 per year rent) and a smaller plot measuring approx. 10.3m x 8m (£16 per year rent).

April's meeting was held on Thursday 15th by video conference, due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Attending the meeting virtually were: Chairman S Fane de Salis, Vice Chairman G Smith, S Jackson-Rimmer, S Parfrey, W Burcham, County Councillor I Gardener, S. Cardwell (Clerk) and 3 members of the public.

The meeting began with the Chairman reading a statement about the death of Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh and expressing condolences. This was followed by a one-minute silence.

Here is some of what was discussed, based on the draft minutes:

- County Cllr I Gardener updated everyone on the latest Covid figures and to provide details regarding the meeting to discuss safety of the A14 junctions, which has resulted in a site visit being arranged.
- M Ager has provided an update regarding the Footpath 16 issue (Stile missing allowing unrestricted entry to A14 East bound carriageway) has been passed to Highways England to investigate and resolve asap.
- Cllr S Fane de Salis confirmed he attended a meeting with Shailesh Vara MP, County Cllr I Gardener and Highways England regarding junction improvements to the A14 near Spaldwick it was requested that the short slip road on the A14 Westbound be included in the site visits.
- Speedwatch: Cllr
   S Jackson-Rimmer advised that
   Speedwatch sessions are now
   permitted and that there is a new
   coordinator at Huntingdon Police
   HQ. Refresher training is to be
   sourced for Cllr
   S Jackson-Rimmer and two
   other volunteers; additional
   volunteers are also needed.
- Local Highway Improvement:
   CIIr S Jackson-Rimmer has
   spoken to County CIIr
   I Gardener. One suggestion was
   to look at a 20mph speed limit
   on the roads near the school.
- Councillors discussed the poor condition of speed limit signs in Stow Road - one of the signs is barely legible. The issue has been reported online by Cllr S Fane de Salis to the County Council.
- The Parish Council is waiting for an update on whether the mobile Post Office will add Spaldwick to its rounds - Cllr S Parfrey has contacted Royal Mail Central to see if this is possible.

It will be held in Spaldwick Community Room, Covid-19 restrictions permitting.




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
