

## **Spaldwick Primary School news**


The first half of the summer term has seen Spaldwick School spring into action with a firm focus on hard work and, of course, Coronation celebrations!

We wish all of our children a restful May half term. School reopens on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> June.


#### Spaldwick Village Hall Committee update

Here are June's updates from Spaldwick Parish Council:

**THE TING BUS -** Vectare, the Ting bus operator, will be holding a roadshow on Friday 2nd June at 11.15. The bus will be on the High Street, opposite The George, for 30 to 45 minutes. Visitors will be able to have a tour of the bus and there will be advice and assistance on how the service operates and how to book the bus.

**STOW LONGA HILL** - As some of you will be aware, the hill into Stow Longa is being affected by water damage. The verges and road surface are in an extremely poor state. The Parish Council has raised this issue with Ian Gardener, our District and County Councillor. Ian has met with the Flood Authority and the Highways Agency and the issue is being investigated. So far, they have determined that there is a blockage in a water course which has caused the water to divert onto the road. Once the blockage has been cleared, the verges and road surface will be repaired.
