Spaldwick Village Hall Funds: The Future

The Village Hall Committee has had several emails regarding requests about how the funds from the village hall could be transferred to the church to support the work they are doing to provide a community space in its building.

There is currently, and always has been, a church representative on the Committee in order to facilitate these discussions. The Committee met on 9th February 2020, in order to hear the feedback from the church meeting and to discuss the ways forward. The representative reported that there was now a new drive to raise regular income to cover maintenance to stabilise its future, before any further work on the development is progressed.

However, it is noted that, pending further information from the church, the village could agree a way in principle for some or all of the Village Hall funds to support any development, should this go forward. The Committee will raise this again at the next AGM,

bearing in mind that it has been raised at several previous AGMs and was not supported sufficiently to take forward.

In order to put this to the AGM in April, there

would need to be a clear proposal to explain what funds would be required, when, and a breakdown of how these funds would be spent. The church representative is taking this to the Parochial Church Council for further discussion. The committee would also require a written agreement with the church about returning funds if the church subsequently closed or did not use the monies as intended.

If anyone feels they would like to send a different proposal for how to use some or all of the funds, you can do this via the email: villagehall@spaldwick.com and the committee will include your written proposal on the agenda at the next AGM based on the same requirements as above. We will only ask the village to consider those proposals with named proposers.

The Village Hall Committee do not have control over how the funds are spent, they are merely the Trustees of the funds and the village decides on how to use them.

At the 2019 AGM the committee was tasked with establishing a potential long-term investment proposal so that the village could use some of the dividends to support worthy causes in the village (similar to Easton's village funds). Brewin Dolphin are currently in the process of proposing a portfolio for the funds and this will also be presented at the next AGM for consideration.





A14 Safety Concerns



Keyston and Bythorn PCs have recently had a meeting with District Councillor Ian Gardener and the Highways Agency regarding the A14 junctions between Ellington and Thrapston.

They are concerned that the A14 is getting busier and speeds are increasing which means that the junctions between Ellington and Thrapston are no longer fit for purpose.

The earliest that these junctions can be improved will be 2030 so the Highways Agency will be looking into the possibility of reducing the speed limit for this stretch of the road (similar to Southoe on the A1).

Unfortunately, one of the indicators that the Highways Agency uses to see if a road is safe or not is the number of accidents to which the police have been called to. This means that if the police are not called to an accident then the Highways agency are not aware of it.

January's meeting of Spaldwick Parish Council was held on Thursday 16th:

It was Chaired by Steve Fane de Salis - also present were G Smith (Vice Chairman), J Pope, S Jackson-Rimmer, S Parfrey, E Woolward and one member of the public.

Here are some of the items discussed, based on the draft minutes of the meeting:

Monthly Ferriman Road Play Area Inspection:

- Cllr G Smith recommended some recognition for the members of the public for all their hard work in removing the hedges around Ferriman Road Play Area. It was agreed to buy two £50 vouchers from The George as a gift.
- Playground inspection report by Wicksteed Brambles have been removed; the suggested need for the equipment to be repainted will be addressed.

Update regarding dog poo bag dispensers:

 Cllr S J-R suggested that one dispenser should be located on Parish Council Land on the open space by the bridge. This will be discussed with Cllr R Johnson

Community Room:

Consider the purchase of an external sign - ongoing

Other items

- A resident's raised concerns about the location of the Bus Stop on High Street and the issue of parked vehicles causing a problem at this location. A suggestion is to add an additional stop on Stow Road. Cllr R Johnson will canvass neighbours.
- Consider co-opting to fill the vacancy created by Ian Harriman's resignation Only one resident has expressed an interest, W Bircham, and as no others have come forward Cllr G Smith recommends they be co-opted, seconded by Cllr S F de S. Motion carried.
- At a recent Parish Council meeting, District and County Councillor Ian Gardener explained that he is in discussions with the Highways Agency regarding the conditions of the roads in the villages surrounding the A14. He has asked that if anyone has any photos/details regarding the road conditions in Spaldwick and the surrounding areas that they forward them to ian.gardener@cambridgeshire.gov.uk

Councillors' questions:

A resident has contacted The Parish Council regarding vehicles travelling the wrong way through the no entry signs on The Green. They have asked if anything can be done. Cllr S F de S has inspected the signage, and reported there are no right turn and no entry signs clearly visible at this location. A report has been submitted to Cambridgeshire County Council regarding the white lines on the road surface being worn. Cllr G Smith mentioned that new signs have been erected around Spaldwick with two signs on The Green. These have been put up on behalf of National Grid to remind their drivers to stick to the required route, A14, via Catworth to Kimbolton.

Town & Poors Charity Field:

- Update regarding gates and fencing Cllr R Johnson has fixed the posts and gates in place. The bolts have been welded to hinder theft.
- Reply from HDC regarding notification of intent to create allotments A full planning application is required for change of use to create an area for car parking.
- Some quotes received for hard-standing, more awaited.
