There is an increase in scam emails and messages. It is important to know how to report these emails/messages.

How to protect yourself from scam emails and texts:

- Forward suspicious emails to report@phishing.gov.uk
- Forward suspicious text messages to 7726 (it's free)
- Your provider can find out where the text came from and block or ban the sender
- If you have lost money or provided personal information as a result of a scam, notify your bank immediately and report it to action fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or call 0300 123 2040

Stop Scams UK and Global Cyber Alliance have launched the UK-wide 159 call service, which is designed to guarantee consumers a safe route to contacting their banks. 159 works in the same way as 101 for the police or 111 for the NHS. It's the number you can trust to get you through to your bank safely and securely, every time. So, if you think someone is trying to trick you into handing over money or personal details - stop, hang up and call 159 to speak directly to your bank.

Reporting a crime

- If it's an emergency and the crime is still taking place, call 999 and ask for the police.
- If it's not an emergency, do not call 999. This doesn't mean
 the crime is not important it just helps the police to make
 the best use of their resources. Many police forces use the
 101 non-emergency number, so you can ring that number
 instead.
- If you have information regarding a crime and don't want to talk to the police, contact Crimestoppers online or call 0800 555 111. You will remain 100% anonymous. Always.
