Extra speed awareness measures for Spaldwick

Following on from the installation of new 40mph "buffer zones" on all three approaches to Spaldwick, a new MVAS (Mobile Vehicle Activated Sign) has been installed on Stow Road, close to the junction with Ferriman Road.

This is in addition to the MVAS already in place on the High Street, to help slow traffic coming off the A14; and 30mph stickers on recycling bins for homes on routes where there's a high volume of cars, vans and lorries.

Spaldwick Parish Council, which is responsible for the new sign, said: "We hope this will have some affect on the speed that occurs in this area".

Planning application for 15 homes submitted for land east of lvy Way

Another planning application has been submitted - this time for 15 new homes, access and car parking - on the field to the east of Ivy Way. Previous plans for houses on the site have been declined.

You can read the details and comment on the application on the Huntingdonshire District Council website. If you don't have access to the internet, you can view the details, via appointment, at Pathfinder House.

Items which can be taken into account, include highway safety issues, impact on the countryside, parking, trees and landscaping, risk of flooding, smells and impact on listed buildings/conservation area. What can't be taken into account includes loss of a private view, loss of property value, or religious or moral objections.

Comments must be received by 13th November 2023.
