Recent note from Cambridgeshire Police

Over the past few weeks there has been an increase in Dwelling Burglaries. As always we need your help in identifying these offenders and bringing them to justice. Please be mindful of your neighbour's property and report anything or anyone suspicious

Get a friend or neighbour to look after your home.
They can collect your mail open/close curtains, don't leave curtains closed during the day as it gives the impression that no one is at home.
If you leave keys with a neighbour, don't label them with your address.

Make sure your home looks like someone is living in it.
Think about getting automatic time-switches to turn your lights on especially rooms at the front of the property at dusk.
