<u>Mowing</u>

Mow at least once a week now. Make sure mower has been serviced and blade replaced or sharpened.

<u>Fertiliser</u>

This is the time to feed and weed (preferably in that order). The fertiliser is predominately Nitrogen in a slow release form, but it may also need Phosphate and Potassium as well as vital trace elements to promote a vibrant lawn.

Actions required in April

- ♦ Mow Lawn At Least Once Per Week
- ♦ Apply Spring Fertiliser To Produce Vibrant Green Lawn
- ♦ Spray Weeds In Lawn With Selective Herbicide
- ♦ Spray Drive/Path/Patios With Total Herbicide To Keep Weed Free For Summer

Superfast broadband takes a step closer

The formal contract between Cambridgeshire County Council and BT was signed on the 8th March, and there was very good news. Cambridgeshire County Council announced that the project would exceed initial aspirations and provide 98% of homes and businesses in Cambridgeshire with access to high-speed fibre broadband by the end of 2015! Cambridgeshire County Council has been able to achieve such a good deal with BT as a result of obtaining 24,000 registrations for the Connecting Cambridgeshire campaign, thus demonstrating strong demand for high-speed broadband

The project will involve enabling over 100 telephone exchanges serving many more street cabinets. Ranked in order of premises served, our exchange (Woolley) is 14th on the list of exchanges in areas currently without superfast broadband. The Woolley exchange covers Spaldwick, Ellington, Alconbury, Alconbury Weston and parts of Brampton and accounts for about 1,000 of the 24,000 registrations. Thanks to your support, Spaldwick achieved the greatest number of registrations as a proportion of premises.

I am very hopeful that Spaldwick will be included in the roll-out programme. The superfast broadband project team are now working to define a roll-out plan, which should be available in the next few months. The first areas to benefit will see superfast broadband towards the end of 2013. I continue to work closely with the team, and all the latest news about the programme will be reported on the following website page:
