SPALDWICK NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH INCREASED RISK OF BURGLARY DID YOU KNOW?

Some household insurance will not be valid if you have been burgled and criminals gained entry by an insecure window or door.

- 1) Where possible deny access to the rear of your property by use of high fencing and a lockable gate.
- 2) Fit Security lighting which will activate on movement in the gardens
- 3) All doors should be closed and locked even when you are at home
- 4) Use a door chain before committing to answering your door
- 5) All windows should be closed and locked with the keys removed when you are away from the property
- 6) Fitting window restrictors will allow you to safely ventilate your home
- 7) All desirable, expensive or sentimental items including keys should be put out of sight, not visible from windows. Consider investing in an adequate safe, bolted to a solid structure within the property.
- 8) If you are at home and sitting in the garden make sure the front windows and doors are locked.
- 9) Inform neighbours when you go away on holiday
- 10) Try not to make it obvious that the house is unoccupied We are a part of the Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood Watch Community for more information see:

Interested in Becoming a Prison Visitor?

We all know charities which will feed the hungry and clothe the poor, but did you know there is an Official Prison Visitor scheme which runs in both of the prisons in this area?

Official Prison Visiting can be rewarding, frustrating or heartbreaking depending on circumstances, but whatever the OPV's personal feelings there can be little doubt that he or she will have made a difference to the prisoner who has been visited.

All you need is common sense, patience and compassion (and to clear the security checks!). You don't even need to be that good at small talk – you just need to be able to listen. We only ask you to commit a minimum of a half day a month.

There are two prisons near West Perry HMP Littlehey, which is Cat C (low security) and at Littlehey and also a Young Offenders' Institution for 18-21 year-old men. If you are interested in becoming a Prison Visitor, please get in touch with the prison chaplaincy:

Great news for superfast broadband in Spaldwick!

At the 2012 Spaldwick Fete, great attention was placed on securing registrations for our superfast broadband campaign. Less than one year later, the Connecting Cambridgeshire team has announced the areas currently being considered to receive fibre broadband in the very first phase of superfast broadband roll-out. The great news is that Spaldwick is included alongside 50 rural parishes and urban areas!

The first phase of the roll-out is scheduled to deliver connectivity from December 2013 through to June 2014, with the first cabinets going 'live with fibre' by the end of 2013

Over the coming months, BT Openreach (and its contractors') engineers and surveyors will be carrying out detailed planning for Phase 1. If surveys reveal unexpected issues, this may affect when an area is connected. We expect to bring you further information in September when we hope to confirm a 'go live' date for superfast broadband. Before the launch of services, the Spaldwick website will provide comprehensive guides on superfast broadband services and pricing. Fibre broadband services are already relatively affordable - costing only a few pounds more than conventional broadband - while delivering download and upload speeds of up to 76Mbps and 19Mbps, respectively.
