After two and a half years since the theft of lead from the church roof it is now being re-covered with stainless steel instead, this will hopefully not be stolen as happened twice to the original covering.

The scaffolding pictured is to save workers from falling and to keep the rain out whilst the work is in progress. It adds considerably to the cost and will account for about £7500 of the overall cost of £25000.

Work has been delayed until now partly by concern for the bat roosts in the roof. The church accounts for 2013 are shown on page 11. These will be considerably depleted by our contribution of £5000 to the cost.
