The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held in the Community Room at Spaldwick school on Thursday 17th July at 8 pm. Members of the public are welcome to attend and may address the meeting on relevant matters during the Open Forum.

Local Highway Improvement Initiative 2015/16

The Parish Council has been invited to submit a proposal for funding from the Cambridgeshire County Council Local Highway Improvement Initiative in 2015/16. Schemes will be jointly funded with up to £10,000 contributed by the County Council and at least 10% of the scheme cost by the Parish Council. Projects could involve any highway measure or improvement that is considered to offer benefit to the local community and could include minor improvements for as little as £500.

Applications will be assessed by a panel comprised of local County Councillors from within each district council area which will prioritise proposals based on the information provided.

Panels will score each of the proposals received against the following aims of the LHI initiative and those with marks above the cut off level determined by the total budget available will be taken forward

1) Persistent Problems:

The degree to which ongoing difficulties are addressed

2) Road Safety:

The degree to which a proposal could reduce hazards or improve road safety

3) Community Improvement: (social or economic)

The degree to which a proposal addresses something felt to be very important locally.

To enable the Parish Council to produce a scheme which reflects the views of the public, residents are invited to submit suggestions to the Parish Clerk by Friday July 11th. Should your suggestion be considered feasible you may be asked to work with the Council to develop a scheme for submission to the panel.

Q. Is fibre broadband expensive?

A. Absolutely not. Villagers who have already ordered have been surprised by how little it costs (a few pounds a month). If you shop around, you could pay less for superfast broadband than you pay now for super-slow broadband.

Q. Should I really bother?

A. That's a bit like asking whether it's worth staying with candles at the arrival of electricity. In Grafham – the very first village in Cambridgeshire to get superfast fibre broadband – most villagers already have the service and the feedback has been extremely positive. Grafham's Broadband Champion says, "Everyone loves it!"

Superfast Broadband For Spaldwick – It's Now LIVE!

It is with great delight that we can announce the arrival of superfast fibre broadband to the village. Spaldwick is one of a tiny number of small villages in the UK that no longer has to

suffer with super-slow speeds. We did it!

The service went live on Tuesday 24th June 2014, and you can now order the service from your existing broadband provider, or you could seize the opportunity to change supplier.

The first date for installations is 1st July, with some installations now scheduled for late July due to substantial initial demand. We recommend that you get your order in as quickly as possible to avoid delays.

The website also contains a comprehensive questions and answers page. Below are brief answers to some of the most popular questions:

Q. What is fibre broadband?

A. Conventional broadband (launched 10 years ago) is a super-slow service that can no longer meet modern demands for Internet access. Fibre broadband represents the next generation of broadband, and has already been extensively deployed in cities and towns across the UK to deliver much greater speeds and improve reliability.

Q. Why should I opt for fibre broadband?

A. Quite simply, fibre broadband will significantly improve your broadband speeds, and will be more reliable. This means that you'll be able to do a lot more with the Internet, more quickly and with less frustration! No more stuttering with iPlayer or Youtube, and broadband will no longer be the bottleneck in households with multiple users and devices (e.g. mobile phones, tablets, notebooks, game consoles and set-top boxes).

Q. What speeds would I get?

A. Everyone in Spaldwick should get significantly greater speeds than they do now. On average across the village, speeds should increase by a factor of 10. Download speeds will be up to about 76Mbps.

Q. Do I automatically get fibre broadband?

A. No, there is no automatic migration from conventional broadband, so you have to take proactive action to order the service. Many people are upgrading to fibre broadband with their existing supplier, although most have the opportunity to move provider for a better deal.

Last but not least, a big thank you to the talented flower arrangers and helpers who transformed the church into such a delightfully fragrant and



interesting space with so much information about village history.

After a quiet start, visitor numbers picked up and by mid-afternoon the village was buzzing.

We had lots of feed-back from visitors saying how much they had enjoyed the afternoon's events.

Parents also expressed their pleasure

that there was something for the children to enjoy.

I'm sure everyone will be delighted to know that we took **just over £1500** which will go to local charities.

The next meeting of the Gardening Club will be on Wednesday 9th July at 8pm at Chestnut View, High Street, Spaldwick.

If the weather is good we will hope to take some Summer cuttings in the garden.
