LOOK AFTER YOUR CHILDREN AT HOME

Window Blinds. Do you realise that window blind cords kill children every year? They can get caught in the looped cords and not have the strength to free themselves. Make sure that the cords are fastened up out of their reach.

Nappy Sacks. Do you store nappies in baby's room? Several babies have been suffocated simply by falling asleep on top of a plastic sack, the thinness of the plastic makes it cling to the face as they breath in and small babies are unable to pull it away.

Button Batteries Small children and babies instinctively put things in their mouths. All types of batteries contain acid which can be fatal if swallowed. If you save batteries to re-cycle make sure that they are in a container out of reach of your children.

Liquitab Detergents. These tablets, used in washing machines, look very much like sweets to small children. Store them out of reach and out of sight.

A third of Spaldwick households flock to superfast broadband in just three weeks!

Last month, we announced the arrival of superfast broadband in Spaldwick - ahead of many much larger towns and villages in the UK. The first installa-



tions commenced on 1st July. Within three weeks, a third of Spaldwick households had already subscribed to fibre broadband. We're now rapidly approaching 40% take-up - with more than 240 residents accessing highspeed fibre broadband already!

Feedback has been very positive. Don't take our word for it. You can find lots of information about fibre broadband and comments from villagers who have already upgraded on the village website:

Broadband Champion Mark Heath said, "Initial take-up has been phenomenal and many people have told me that they expect to upgrade in the next few weeks. I'm a bit surprised that some residents suffering the worst speeds in the village speeds with conventional broadband - sometimes less than 1Mbps - haven't upgraded yet as they will see the biggest gains. They are currently paying such a lot of money for broadband for so little."

So far, the greatest download speed improvement has been achieved in Fuller Close, where the download speed for one resident increased from 1Mbps to 43Mbps!

There is only a small price premium if you upgrade to fibre broadband with your current provider and, if you are prepared to change provider, you could actually pay less than you do now for a superslow broadband service.
