There have been a number of thefts from Motor Vehicles in our local area.

Some advice from the Police:

- 1: Always keep your car locked.
This includes closing the sunroof and windows, even if you only leave for a few seconds.
- 2: Do not leave anything in your car, particularly when it is parked overnight.
63% of thefts from vehicles happen when they are parked outside the home.
- 3: Park with care. Park in busy or well-lit areas near CCTV cameras, or in police approved car parks (Look out for the 'ParkMarkTM' on signs) if possible.
You can find out which car parks are approved at www.saferparking.com
- 4: Finally remove any signs that a Satellite Navigation System has been in the car by cleaning tell-tale marks from the windscreen.

I've set myself a couple of initial tasks:

Firstly, arrange training for all volunteers (current and new): a training session has been arranged with Brian Robbins in the Community Room on Thursday 9th July from 7pm.

Secondly, set up regular Speedwatch sessions: once everyone has received training I intend to work out a rota so that Speedwatch sessions can take place more regularly.

Until we can arrange some regular sessions I am hoping that I can organise a Speedwatch session within the next two weeks (with those volunteers that have previously received training). There have been a number of complaints on the Spaldwick Village Facebook page about the speed of some vehicles coming through the village.
