A NEW TWIST WITH BANK SCAMS

Fraudsters are using a new scam to make the people they are phoning believe they are speaking to a trusted organisation by programming their phones to display any number they choose.

The scam, known as 'number spoofing', works by fraudsters cloning the telephone number of the organisation they want to impersonate and then making this number appear on the victim's caller ID display when they telephone them on a landline.

Always remember banks will **NEVER EVER** ask you to reveal your bank details or transfer money by telephone. If you get such a call put the phone down even if it is apparently from a recognizable number listed in your phone's directory.

Call 101 - For all non-emergencies, general enquiries and to report crime. In an emergency, when a life is in danger or there is a risk of violence or serious injury or when a serious crime is being committed please **call 999**.

Or use Crimestoppers to make a report anonymously by calling 0800 555 111 or by using their on-line contact form.

TREES



The District Council is offering 'free' trees to parishes for planting in open spaces in their villages and their surrounding countryside. Each year some 400 individual trees have been given out to some 30 differing Parishes and over 30 years some 22,500 trees have been distributed.

Spaldwick Parish Council is taking part in this scheme, which this year will be distributing more trees than usual (4500) as the scheme will probably be ceased early in 2017.

Trees and hedging can be used to improve local areas of open space, footpaths and bridleways, school grounds or cemeteries as well as creating a small copse or woodland. It is also open to individuals and, in view of the number of trees available, landowners in particular are encouraged to take as many as they can manage and hopefully create small copses on their land.

Please contact the Spaldwick Tree Warden email richardjohnsonbuilder@btinternet.com or the Parish Clerk Ramune Mimiene email clerkspaldwick.pc@gmail.com who will collate the orders for the village.

The species available are Oak, Crab Apple, Wild Service Tree, Bird Cherry, Wild Cherry, Lime, Plum, Field Maple, Aspen, Birch. Also White Willow and Black Poplar can be supplied as large hardwood cuttings.

The deadline for the receipt of orders is December 5th 2016 so orders should be passed to the Tree Warden in time for him to meet this date
