#### Hang up on fraud.

Concerned about cold calls and fraudulent scams? NHWN is working with <u>Financial Fraud Action UK</u> on a campaign to combat telephone scams.

Try to report any scam email messages or telephone calls which you receive claiming to be from an official body asking for personal details, promising rewards, prizes or shares of fortunes for small fees. You can report on-line at ActionFraud or by telephone 0300 123 2040 to report these crimes.

#### Beware of a new "scam tool" - Caller ID "Spoofing"

The "cold caller" has a new and significant weapon in their armory which assists them to be persuasive in convincing doubting victims to part with their cash at the bank. They can create a fake Caller ID showing on your phone which appears to show that the caller is from your authentic bank phone number.

Call 101 - For all <u>non-emergencies</u>, general enquiries and to report crime In an emergency, when a life is in danger or there is a risk of violence or serious injury or when a serious crime is being committed please <u>call 999</u>. Or use <u>Crimestoppers</u> to make a report <u>anonymously</u> by calling 0800 555 111 or by using their on-line contact form.

#### YOUR NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE

Did you know that you may buy a packet of paracetamol in Boots for 25p or you can go to your doctor and get a prescription which then costs the NHS £45? Unbelievable but apparently true, so please do-it-yourself in future with paracetamol, indigestion tabs, antihistamines and other over the counter medicines.

#### SPALDWICK COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

The aim of the scheme:

**Community Speedwatch** is a scheme to allow trained volunteers to address speed concerns in their communities. This is achieved by:

- 1. Undertaking high-visibility roadside operations to educate speeding drivers, by displaying their speed on a digital display with a view to improving driver behaviour.
- 2. Reporting to the Police the details of speeding vehicles in specific areas where speed is of concern. These speed monitoring reports enable the police to
- a. Send advisory letters to the registered owners to confirm to them the speed at which their vehicle was travelling and that the speed was in excess of the speed limit.
- b. Use the data gathered to inform Police and others on the allocation of resources and general road safety issues.
- 3. Delivering locally based feedback and problem solving schemes where speeding is of specific concern to the Community, operated by trained volunteers and supported by the Police.
- 4. Speedwatch is not enforcement: it is about raising awareness of speeding within communities and educating drivers. We run regular speedwatch sessions within the village. During our recent session in January we assessed 101 vehicles and reported one for exceeding the speed limit.
