Here is a summary of recent incidents in our area:

13.03.2017 - Stoneley Road, Easton

Unknown offender(s) have syphoned diesel from a vehicle whilst parked on a driveway.

18.03.2017 - The Lane, Easton

Unknown offender(s) have stolen the public access defibrillator.

Monday 20th March 2017, Police received a report of a burglary occurring at <u>Common Lane</u>, <u>Hemingford Abbots</u>, this was the second time in a matter of weeks that this property has been targeted.

A special constable with the British Transport police saw a number of men exit the victims address. Another resident had seen the suspects climb over his fence wearing balaclavas and carrying a black box. They then got into a silver Ford Mondeo which was driven away at high speed. The offending vehicle was located by officers from Northamptonshire Police, a pursuit occurred but came to an end the pursuit after the vehicle was driven at high speed in the wrong direction on a dual carriageway. The vehicle was later found abandoned in Rushden and another member of the public found a discarded safe believed to be linked to this burglary.

This incident demonstrates how important it is for members of the public to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity, no matter how insignificant you feel it may be.

Did you know that Spaldwick has a No Cold Calling Zone (NCCZ) in Royston Avenue?

A joint effort between Cambridgeshire County Council Protection Team and Spaldwick Parish Council intends to extend this initiative to the whole village under the title of Spaldwick Good Neighbours Scheme.

Spaldwick Good Neighbours Scheme will be able to offer a range of materials for residents including door stickers, advice on how to spot a roque trader and tips to prevent unwanted mail and phone calls and to spot IT scams. It is the intention to expand it to achieve so much more. For example residents can support their neighbours by putting bins in and out for the more infirm or during holiday periods. collecting prescriptions for those in poor health or without vehicle access, organising events to increase social cohesion, joining the Library at Home service to support housebound readers and creating book and jigsaw exchange schemes.

Keeping an eye out for your neighbour can make all the difference, reduce isolation to those alone and build strong communities.

Mike Robinson Vice Chairman of Spaldwick Parish Council has agreed to be the lead and local co-ordinator in setting up this scheme. If you would like more information, need any advice or can help with the scheme in any way we would welcome your support.



Re-ordering St James' Church - first ideas!

MEMBERS OF THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL have met with two architects now, and an outline scheme is on the table at last. We want to retain the special nature of the church, but make it more suitable for modern use. By doing so, we not only make a more flexible and useful worship space, but also make that space available to the whole community for a variety of uses at other times. This is something that the Diocese and Church of England nationally are keen to see happen, and there are bodies offering grants to help with the cost. We are also working in consultation with the Village Hall Committee and others to see how together we can best address Spaldwick's overall community provision.



The plan above is <u>just our first idea</u> of how to do this. The main features are:

- Clear the whole church of pews, to be replaced by comfortable, movable chairs.
- Screen off (tastefully) the meeting room and chancel, leaving the ability to open up the screen between the chancel and nave for big services/occasions.
- Build a new kitchen at the west end, along with space for storage chair storage of chairs and so on.

- Raise the bell-ringing chamber to a new mezzanine floor in the tower, and build toilets and possibly vestry below.
- Install a new nave floor incorporating under-floor heating.

Every generation has inherited the church building and re-designed it to suite contemporary needs. This is a huge project, but support has been expressed from many people who can see what we are trying to achieve for the church fellowship and the wider village community. We welcome your comments and suggestions.
