

Burglary Updates September

Ansley Way, **St Ives**. Unknown offender(s) have entered the rear garden and gained entry by forcing a rear patio window. They have smashed the interior patio door to gain entry to the main house. They have conducted an untidy search and left.

Valiant Square, **Bury**. Unknown offender(s) have attempted to enter a house by kicking the front door causing damage, before smashing a glass side door to gain entry. **Cash and jewellery stolen.**

Welland Court, **Eaton Ford**. A rear window has been shattered and unknown offender(s) have gained entry. An untidy search was conducted, it appears **cash and jewellery** stolen.

Sambar Close, **Eaton Socon**. Unknown offender(s) have smashed a rear patio window and conducted an untidy search. **Jewellery has been stolen.**

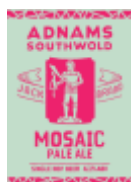
