Residential burglary - crime prevention advice

Reports of burglaries across the district show an increase in the run up to Christmas.

Our burglary team are investigating all reported offences, and both highly-visible and plain-clothed patrols are taking place across our area. In some offences, we are seeing a small hole made in glass doors in order to reach and unlock the door from inside. Burglars will usually gain access to properties to the rear.

Help protect your home:-

- Remove keys from the inside of the doors
 (note that not doing so could invalidate your insurance, or reduce the value of a claim)
- Lock all doors and windows, even if you plan to be away from home for a short time
- Ensure all security lighting is operational during the hours of darkness
- If you have a burglar alarm, make sure that it is set
- Inform your neighbours if you are going away
