15/02372/FUL, Spaldwick Service Area - Replacement of existing fire damaged building with larger unit incorporating a convenience store, food preparation and service areas and extensive seating. Removal of HGV fuelling facility and refurbishment of site area to provide increased customer parking. Reduction in size of existing forecourt canopy.
15/02396/FUL, Land West Side of Long Lane (Brown's Lane) - Two residential dwellings.

Escape Youth Group

We are looking for someone who would be interested in training to become a youth worker. As reported previously, Tony who has been with us for 18 months, has been off work for a while, and may or may not be able to return. We have discussed our options with Huntingdon Youth Services, and would like to offer to support someone local to train to a minimum status of Level 1 youth worker, and possibly up to Level 2. This would be a paid position, and all training would be provided by HYS. The position is open to anyone aged 18 and upwards. If you are interested in youth work, this could be a great opportunity, further details will be provided shortly.
