



Woolley Hill Wind Farm Community Fund



Community grants of up to £5,000 are now available, with Spaldwick being a qualifying area for the Woolley Hill Wind Farm Community Fund.

Village organisations which benefited in 2017 included Spaldwick Carpet Bowls Club, receiving £4,050 to provide replacement carpet bowls equipment, scoring frames, and a winding machine.

Update from Cambridgeshire Constabulary



Police in Cambridgeshire say there have been complaints made regarding the use of off-road motorbikes in Spaldwick and surrounding villages.

The Constabulary has told us it is investigating and making inquiries to identify those responsible. They have

also issued guidance about what is and isn't acceptable, in the eyes of the law.

A spokesperson said: "They can be ridden on private land only. Any use on public land, a highway or otherwise is not permitted.

"It should be noted that if such vehicles are used on the road/pavement, not only may the rider be committing a number of offences but their parents may also face prosecution.

"Therefore, we ask parents to carefully consider this advice before allowing young people to use such a vehicle".
