The mutli-agency networks have seen a reduction in crime in some rural areas by more than 23%.

The scheme is not only for those living in Cambridgeshire's countryside, it also targets horse owners, rural businesses and all those that use and enjoy the countryside.

The Church Roof The temporary covering put on the day after the theft of the lead is serving its purpose very well. It may be year or two before we raise enough money to make a permanent repair so Grahame Leach has acquired some more lasting material which will be put on shortly. We expect the new covering will be stainless steel or zinc and it will be put on the whole roof, with the remaining lead being sold to offset the cost. There are cheaper alternatives but, with a Grade 1 listed church there is a lot of opposition from English Heritage, and most other organisations concerned, dispensing with the lead is itself no more than a forced concession to the reality of further thefts.

We have made a start on raising the £20000 estimated cost and have over £600 . The several fund raising functions mentioned on page 7 will also help, whilst more are planned. Also, of course we are applying to a range of organisations such as English Heritage who will probably provide the bulk of the funds, but they like to see that we are also doing our bit

Broadband News!

Our BT exchange (located in Woolley) has now been unbundled, so the exchange now houses new ADSL2+ equipment installed by TalkTalk. This means that Spaldwick residents can now take advantage of higher speeds and lower prices.

With my new TalkTalk -based Xilo service, I now achieve a downlink speed of 6.7Mbps with a throughput of 6Mbps. The uplink is also faster - at 1Mbps. We are so delighted to have had approx 12-17 villagers at our meetings to discuss and support the future of the church in the community, whether from a heritage perspective or worshipper. We have had felt donated for the roof and kindly collected, which will be fitted to the roof by a few villagers shortly. This will last a couple of years while we source grant aid and investigate appropriate alternatives to put a permanent roof covering in place. We have highlighted the need to put a toilet in the church, necessary for outsiders travelling to the village for funerals or weddings, and would also enable more community usage of the space through this modernisation. Again this requires someone to help with sourcing grants and the opportunity for community fundraising. Mission: St James providing an inclusive and thriving community church.
