

The Ivy Way resident, who is about to celebrate his 15th birthday, is travelling to Ghana in July 2020 to help with improvement projects at his school's partner institution, Essaman United, as well as volunteering with outreach projects in the local community.

Although it's a school-led project, each child has to raise the money to get there.

Following on from time spent volunteering in the village, where he litter-picked as part of his Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award, Alex is now keen to generate funds for the trip by offering his services for a donation. The teenager is willing to do all

sorts of work, from lawn mowing to fence painting, and from garden watering to baby sitting.

Alex's school will be working with 'Partner Schools Worldwide', something that they have been doing since 2011. Over the last few years, pupils who visited Ghana have worked on creating a library, providing a new assembly space and hand washing facilities, as well as a new sports pitch for the community. This year's project will include coming up with ways to harvest rain water for local farming projects and for generating energy.

While they are there, students will also get chance to experience Ghanaian culture, and explore a little of the country, including visiting cocoa plantations and the rainforest.

Roll of Honour - In St James, we have a Roll of Honour listing the men from Spaldwick and Barham who fought in the Great War of 1914-18, and gave their lives for their country (pictured right). Whilst the document is framed it had been damaged in several places. We were very fortunate that John and Jill Bristow from Little Paxton took it upon themselves to repair and make good this piece of local history. As volunteers for the War Memorial Trust they undertake various restoration projects as a hobby in the local area.

However, they found that the frame on our Roll of Honour was original and had been badly damaged, so they sent it away to a professional restoration company where a mould was made of

the plaster frame and the damaged areas subsequently renewed. The document itself was cleaned and with it they found a copy of a church brochure from 1921 which has been replaced back in the frame too. The frame has now been professionally sealed and the original document is preserved for the next 500 years.

This really is a beautiful piece of local history and is now back in St James Church, so do get in touch if you would like to see it in the near future. We are very grateful for the generosity of John and Jill for their dedication and attention to detail in ensuring the document will be preserved and look its very best.



Spaldwick Parish Council News

May's Annual Meeting of Spaldwick Parish Council was held on Thursday 16th. The Chairman is Steve Fane de Salis. Also present were: S. Fane de Salis, S. Jackson-Rimmer, J. Pope, CC Cllr I. Gardener, HD Cllr J. White & one member of the public

Here are some of the points discussed, based on the draft minutes:

S. Fane de Salis was elected as Chairman; S. Jackson-Rimmer was elected as Vice-Chairman.

Planning - To consider new planning consultations: Demolish existing house and erect ten 3-5

- bedroom dwellings with associated parking at House On The Hill, Stow Road. Following discussions, Spaldwick Parish Council proposed approval on the basis that it is a small amount of sustainable development that will contribute to the economic future of the village. The Parish Council like to see development proposing affordable housing in the village, and have suggested a footpath on both sides of Stow Road, (up to Mount Pleasant on one side and to link up with the existing footpath on the other side), to allow for a potential increase in school-age population.
- **Grant request from Playtimes, Spaldwick -** The pre-school are in the process of raising money for improvements and have made an enquiry regarding funding available for the forthcoming year.
- **Monthly Ferriman Road Play Area's Inspection-** Hedges are overgrown but the equipment ok (some bolts are missing, but do not affect safety. These are being monitored).
- There was broken glass found in the play park last month (pictured above). The Parish Council would like to extend their thanks to the people that cleaned it up.


