

Improving broadband in Spaldwick!

I promised that I would keep you informed of broadband developments in Spaldwick. In this edition, I have news on both standard broadband and superfast broadband, as I know many villagers are struggling with poor speeds and/or unreliable service.

TalkTalk services are proving popular

I've previously alerted you to the fact that TalkTalk has introduced unbundled broadband services to our local telephone exchange at Woolley. Quite a number of Spaldwick residents have already moved over to TalkTalk, and I can confirm that they quality is excellent, with download and upload speeds significantly better than with BT services. For more information, view the www.spaldwick.com/woolley-broadband webpage.

Currently, TalkTalk is offering its TalkTalk Plus service for 12 months for £7.25 per month (plus £9.50 line rental). This provides unlimited broadband and free calls at any time. Offering further choice, other high-quality ISPs (e.g. Xilo) offer services using the TalkTalk network.

Help bring superfast broadband to Spaldwick

There's only so far that we'll be able to go with standard broadband, and Spaldwick really needs superfast broadband. You'll find five good reasons for superfast broadband at www.spaldwick.com/reasons-superfast-broadband. A recent survey revealed that about 69% of respondents would be put off from buying a "beautiful new house" if it lacked fast broadband. So, even if you don't use broadband much, there are strong reasons why Spaldwick must not lose out.

The positive news is that, helped with Government money, Cambridgeshire County Council is planning to bring superfast broadband to 90% of homes in Cambridgeshire. To prioritise where the money is spent, Cambridgeshire County Council has launched an online survey to gauge demand. This is our chance to get ahead of other, perhaps bigger, villages in the superfast broadband league table.
