

## Did you know...?

People have been living and working in Spaldwick since the Bronze Age, and excavations near Spaldwick Church have previously revealed a series of ditches and pits dating from 1000 BC.

The village was recorded in 1086 in the Domesday Book as comprising an area of land of about 450 acres, although the Domesday Book did not record a church.



It is believed that a small stone church was here in the late 12th century, of which the north wall and small parts of the east wall remain. The church stood in a large area enclosed with a ditch and bank at the west end of the village. This enclosure, known as Bury Close, was probably the site of the Bishop of Lincoln's manor house or grange, but there has not been a house here for many years. The Church of St James the Great is a Grade 1 listed building.

The height from the ground to the top of the spire is 46 metres (152 feet). Construction of the tower begun about the middle of the 14th century. The tower, together with its spire, was completed by the end of the 14th century. It was struck by lightning on 30th May 1904, before being partly rebuilt. The spire was again damaged during a storm on the 25th May 1953.



#### **CALLING ALL KNITTERS**

Myself & a few friends are now using up spare balls of wool to make Bonding Squares for Hinchingbrooke Maternity Unit.

Bonding Squares are generally used by mums whose babies are in a neonatal unit. Each mum is given 2 squares. One is kept with the baby & one is kept on mum's body. Every 12 hrs they are swopped over. This helps both mum & baby to bond by smell in these cases where they cannot physically touch.

These squares are approx. 5/6" & are needed in matching pairs. Easy & fun to knit whilst using up odd balls of wool.

If anyone would like to join us in making some please let me know & I can let you have a few patterns even though any stitches & ideas will do. I have already sent 50 pairs to the unit but they would like us to make this an ongoing project as they can never have enough.

They came together with over 6,000 other children from primary schools across the country to form part of the world's biggest school choir, beautifully singing a medley of songs.


Organisers of the national event say they "believe passionately in inspiring the next generation to find their love for music".


