


Everyone is welcome to join the weekly sessions, with those taking part each asked to consider a voluntary donation of £5.

Primary school places announced

Parents and Carers of 4-year-olds in the Spaldwick area have been finding out if their child has secured a place at the village school on Royston Avenue.

Jonathan Lewis, Cambridgeshire's Service Director for Education, said: "It is really important that applicants use all three of their preferences when applying for a school place and that they include their catchment school. This will give them the best chance of securing a place at a school close to their home."

April 16th marked 'National Offer Day' for primary-aged pupils, bringing joy for many local families.

This year saw an increase in the total number of applications for primary school places with 6,890 applications for reception places at Cambridgeshire schools for September 2019 - up from 6,763 last year.

Careful what you flush down the loo!

Anglian Water is urging Spaldwick residents to carefully dispose of items that shouldn't be flushed down the loo.

Engineers have recently dealt with waste water issues, including blocked drains and problems at the village's pumping station. This has led to overflowing sewage and, of course, a terrible smell!

Unflushable items include: wet wipes, cotton buds, sanitary items which combine with fats, oils and greases in sewers to create so-called 'fatbergs,' an example of which can be seen in the photo on the left.

A spokesperson for Anglian Water told Spaldwick News: "Our Keep it Clear campaign aims to raise awareness about the impact of wrongly flushing wet wipes, cotton buds and sanitary items has in our sewer networks and the wider environment.

"We clear 40,000 blockages across our network every single year - that equates to one blockage roughly every five minutes. Of these blockages, 80% are completely avoidable but cost us a whopping £19million a year to keep our sewers free of them. This money could ultimately be better spent elsewhere.

"Not only that but blockages can lead to sewers flooding in peoples homes and pollution in the wider environment. This is why people should only flush the three P's down their toilet – Pee, Poo and (Toilet) Paper."

Council officials thank Spaldwick residents for reporting large scale fly-tip



Huntingdonshire District Council say they will continue to "monitor the area closely" after a large-scale fly-tip on Belton's Hill. The authority is thanking residents for reporting the dumped box trailer and additional waste in March, which sparked an investigation by Enforcement Officers.

Anyone caught fly tipping can be issued with a fixed penalty notice of £400. Serious offences of fly tipping are punishable by an unlimited fine or up to five years in prison.

The CLA represents thousands of farmers, landowners and rural businesses across the country.

Responding to the incident near Spaldwick, CLA East Regional Director Ben Underwood said: "Incidents of fly-tipping in the countryside are all too common with almost two-thirds of farmers and landowners affected by fly-tipping each year. It's not just the odd bin bag but large household items from unwanted sofas to broken washing machines, building materials and even asbestos being dumped across our countryside."

Mr Underwood continued: "Farmers and landowners are forced to clear up somebody else's rubbish or they risk prosecution for illegal storage of waste. This is simply not right.

"Action is needed to tackle this blight on our beautiful countryside. The CLA believes greater enforcement of fines for those caught fly-tipping as well as the seizure of vehicles is necessary to deter others from committing this crime."

Ensure that you have noted down the date, time and place of the incident; the type and amount of dumped waste and a description of any people or vehicles involved.

If the rubbish has been fly-tipped on private land you will need to contact the landowner

March's meeting of Spaldwick Parish Council was held on Thursday 21st March The Chairman is Steve Fane de Salis. Also present were: G Smith, S Jackson-Rimmer, J Pope and one member of the public.

Here are some of the points discussed, based on the draft minutes:

- ♦ **Public Open Forum** A member of the public spoke to express concerns regarding the planning application for construction of four single-storey affordable dwellings on the Land West Side of Long Lane, mentioning similar objections raised previously including conservation of wildlife and vehicular access.
- ♦ **Dog Fouling -** M.Ager (Spaldwick Footpath Coordinator for the Parish Council) has raised the issue of Dog Fouling and owners not clearing up after their dogs. The Parish Council was disappointed to hear that some people are not removing their own dog's mess, but are leaving others to clear up after them.
- ♦ **Litter in Spaldwick:** Someone fly-tipped on the concrete path from Barham Road beside the A14. This was reported online by both Cllr S Jackson-Rimmer and the Clerk. All the litter has now been cleared (See separate article in this month's Spaldwick News). It was also noted that litter has been raised as an issue in the Long Lane area. Cllr S Fane de Salis to enquire about the use of litter pickers.
- ♦ Community Room 3 quotes for renovation of the kitchen have been received since last month's meeting. Proposed by Cllr S Fane de Salis and seconded by Cllr J Pope that the cheapest quote should be accepted. 3 quotes are in progress for the replacement of curtains (Cllr S Jackson-Rimmer) and 3 quotes are in progress for replacement of flooring (Cllr G Smith).
- ♦ **Spaldwick War Memorial** A request has been received from St James PCC following communication with the Church Buildings department at the diocese to get consent to put the old war memorial in the churchyard. Details requested for this to move forward include photographs of the memorial, details of where it is going to be put in the churchyard, and how it is going to be fixed. A

"statement of needs" has been requested detailing the needs and motivations behind the proposed relocation. It was decided that Cllrs S Fane de Salis and G Smith will work on this item together.

- **Monthly Ferriman Road Play** Area's Inspection - A painting schedule is to be prepared. Hedges around open space and play area - Clirs S Fane de Salis and I Harriman assessed the Play Area following the February Parish Council meeting, concluding the hedges had not been cut the previous year despite the work having been allocated to a contractor. Their conclusion was that, given the extensive number of brambles growing in the hedges, that the most logical suggestion might be to remove all hedges. This will need to be put to tender; Cllr S Fane de Salis to source contacts for quotes.
- ♦ TOWN & POORS CHARITY FIELD - Discussions followed the main Parish Council meeting. The future use of the field, water supply, maintenance and security was central to discussions.
- ♦ Cllr G Smith updated the Council regarding the water connection. Cllr R Johnson was intending to complete connections during the weekend of 30th March. Once sorted, Cllr G Smith will contact Anglian Water. Cllr R Johnson to request meeting in the field with Cllrs S Fane de Salis and G Smith to measure for allotment plots.




