Going on Holiday - While you're away Don't make it obvious that your home is empty. Use timer switches for lights (preferably upstairs), radios (tuned to talk stations), and a 'fake TV' flickering light box. Ask a neighbour to keep a car parked in the driveway. Ask someone to take in mail, milk, dustbins etc. If you have a trusted neighbour, friend or relative with a key, ask them to close the curtains at night and open them in the morning.

**Don't give clues to burglars!** This might sound obvious, but it's actually very easy to accidentally give away clues about your location on social media. It might be via 'checking in' somewhere or even something as simple as leaving your phone's GPS service turned on or uploading a photo to the internet.

**Valuables** Keep valuables hidden out of sight and not viewable from windows. Keep jewellery and credit cards secure and house deeds and other important legal documents in banks. Burglars look in 'safe' spots such as under mattresses and in shoeboxes and tins. Never keep large amounts of cash at home. Never leave packaging from new valuables such as computers and televisions visible with your general rubbish.

The next scheduled meeting of the Council will be on Thursday 17th September at 8 pm in the Community Room at Spaldwick School. Members of the public are welcome to attend and may address the meeting on relevant matters during the Open Forum.

### Local Highway Improvement Initiative

Spaldwick Parish Council Is about to prepare an application for improvements to the highways (streets and adjoining footways) in Spaldwick for inclusion in the 2016/17 scheme. Residents of the village are invited to send suggestions to the Clerk for consideration by the Parish Council.

Applications could involve any highway measure or improvement that is considered to offer benefit to the local community. Traffic calming, parking restrictions, speed limit changes and footway and pedestrian crossing improvements are some of the most common proposals that are delivered by this initiative.

In recent years Spaldwick has benefitted from the scheme by completion of the footway to Ivy Way; roundels painted on the roads at the start of the 30 mph zone; re-kerbing adjacent to the High Street post box to reduce over running on the grass verge; improving the footway outside 7 Thrapston Road to improve drainage and dropping the kerb on each side of the driveway.

Applications can be made for a maximum County Council contribution of £10,000, subject to the Parish Council contributing at least 10% of the total cost. Those submitted by communities in Huntingdonshire will be considered by a County Council panel and scored between 0 and 5 depending on the degree of improvement they will contribute to the scheme objectives. The applications for each district area are prioritised in score order and the contribution for each scheme is allocated in accordance with panel recommendations.

## Flying the flags at Spaldwick Fete

With a record attendance of 653 people (650 in 2014), the event was enjoyed by people of all ages. The UK-US theme meant that the colours red, white and blue were in evidence everywhere and this year we had the opportunity to fly full size flags at the school courtesy of House of Flags, Kimbolton. The Union Jack and the Stars and Stripes watched over us as we participated in a range of activities from apple bobbing to archery



and face painting to line dancing. New this year was the dunk tank, which caused shrieks of delight when adults got dunked good and proper in water supplied by a fire engine... it wasn't as clean and pure as tap water so they were brave and game souls.

Also new this year was the numbered raffle with 14 rather lovely prizes up for grabs, the most popular of which was the meal for four at The George, Spaldwick, including wine! Tickets were placed in the chosen bag for each prize which meant that winners really did get something they wanted and this format was a hit. A total of  $\pounds$ 279 was raised (just shy of last year's  $\pounds$ 287) and this will be split a third each to Spaldwick Social Events Group, other groups in the village and MAGPAS (Mid Anglia General Practitioner Accident Service).
